

1998 was an important year for SRT. It became the first Singaporean company on Broadway - as Associate Producer of David Henry Hwang's Golden Child. After opening in Singapore, the production moved to New York, where it received three Tony Award nominations, including one for Best Play. In July, SRT opened Ah Kong's Birthday Party, an interactive dinner theatre performance, which ran for two months and is Singapore's longest-running play.
