SNEAK PREVIEWS

New production of five award-winning plays from the 3rd HP/ACTION Theatre 10-Minute Play Contest.

- SQUEEZE AHEAD! All plays directed by Jennifer Hubbard. Crew: Richard Koh (Stage Manager), Liu Shu Bin (Lighting Operator), He Yin (Sound Operator), Shamus Seow (Stage Assistant), Shery Fangiono (Stage Assistant) & Stella Antakusuma (Stage Assistant).
- 1. DEAD MAN JUMPING. Written by Cindy Koh. Featuring Jerry Hoh (Lim Soon Kong) & Benjamin Wong (Leslie Tan). A young graphic artist befriends a conservative businessman when they meet at the top of an HDB Building. Though complete opposites, they have one major thing in common: a resolve to end it all. Second brize winner
- 2. THE PAINTING. Written by Jane Pek. Featuring Chong Chia Suan (Lisa), Keagan Kang (Paul) & Sandy Philips (Narrator). Paul and Lisa become obsessed with a painting because of its inexplicable emotion it causes in them. Their lives are dominated by the painting, the feeling. But can such intense emotion last? Joint third prize winner.
- 3. SUN-KISSED AND DARK-SWEPT. Written by Jolene Tan. Featuring Mariah Mohd Zainal Abideen (Woman 1) & Sandy Philips (Woman 2). A poetic depiction of a woman who has traded her "unlit" dreams for a seemingly perfect, prosperous life. She regrets the trade and attempts to persuade another woman not to make the same mistake. Is the loss of the ephemeral worth the gain of the worldly? Joint third prize winner.
- 4. AN ACCIDENT. Written by Goh Chay Ngee. Featuring Chong Chia Suan (Girlfriend), Danielle Capretti ("Life" Girl), Godfrey Yeo (Old Man), Ho Su Ching (Mother), Matthew Christian (Son), Robin Tan (Executive), Vincent Chia (Young Man) & Juwanda (Salesman). Through the game of Life, the details are revealed about the death of a poverty-stricken old man. As the wheel stops on each colour, we hear different accounts until we finally learn the Truth. Merit prize winner.
- 5. THE KNOT. Written by Jean Tay. Featuring Jameson Soh (Groom) & Chio Su Ping (Bride). A young bride is silenced by her husband who wants only for her to be a perfect "Mrs Me". In order to keep her perfect, he denies her intimacy and her own true identity. First prize winner.

Workshop productions or dramatised readings of new plays by established and promising playwrights. Complete works or excerpts.

• GOT MOSQUITO, GOT LIZARD. Written by Jean Tay. Directed by Ekachai Uekrongtham. Featuring Nora Samosir. Crew: Seah Yi-lein (Stage Manager & Sound Operator), Leo Pui Fung (Stage Manager & Lighting Operator) & Tan Yan Mei (Stage Assistant). A monologue about an old woman, blood-sucking mosquitos, stupid ants and jumping lizards. Complete work.

- STORM IN THE CURRY POT. Written by Wee Tze Lin. Directed by Sandy Philips. Featuring Robin Tan (John Tan), Loke Loo Pin (Mrs Tan), Neelam Chugh (Delilah), Mohan Sachdev (Mr D'Cruz), Haslynda Mohd Dahlan (Mrs D'Cruz), Darius Tan (Seng) & Hatta Said (Said). Crew: Seah Yi-lein (Stage Manager & Sound Operator), Leo Pui Fung (Stage Manager & Lighting Operator) & Tan Yan Mei (Stage Assistant). John Tan and Delilah D'Cruz face considerable challenges when they announce their sudden engagement. Mrs Tan doesn't want her son to marry a Eurasian. Mr and Mrs D'Cruz don't want their daughter to marry because her "condition". Tension rises when office gossip leads John to suspect Delilah of having an affair with the much older angmo boss. Dramatised reading of complete work.
- SHELTER. Written by Gopal Baratham. Directed by Sandy Philips. Featuring Malti Lalwani (Voice), Benjamin Wong (Leong), Deepti Gupta (Amrit), Darius Tan (Seng) & Vincent Chia (Sam). Crew: Seah Yi-lein (Stage Manager & Sound Operator), Leo Pui Fung (Stage Manager & Lighting Operator) & Tan Yan Mei (Stage Assistant). On the eve of its impending demise, a disembodied voice recalls its encounters with. A tale through the eyes of the unseen and unheard. Complete work.
- THE ACT OF LYING. Written by Jean Tay. Directed by Jenniffer Hubbard. Featuring Loke Loo Pin (Woman 1), Annie Ferrao (Woman 2 & Small 2), Ho Su Ching (Woman 3 & Narrator), Jerry Hoh (Man) & Deepti Gupta (Super Narrator). Crew: Tan Yan Mei (Lighting & Sound Operator). In an effort to atone for her inability to relate with, or even be in the same room as her elderly, invalid grandmother, a playwright writes about her mother and her caretaker. These scenes are surrealistically juxtaposed with imagined scenes from the family's past. Dramatised reading of complete work.
