A TWISTED KINGDOM DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

"Experience: that most brutal of teachers. But you learn, my God do you learn." – C.S. Lewis

The first time I read the script for *A Twisted Kingdom*, I knew it would be a challenge to stage, but I also knew it <u>had</u> to be staged, one way or another. It is a rare play that combines broad archetype with distinct characterization, the shine of the fantastic with the dull glare

of the real, the most universal of themes – no, not love, but suffering – with the painful precision of a single life. The Fool, at once both lovable and annoying, is one of the most indelible characters I have ever encountered, and how he has led us on a merry chase throughout the production process! I am deeply grateful to Lian for his courage and willingness to be vulnerable, and I am especially indebted to Christopher for summoning The Fool from the depths of his imagination, that we may all listen enraptured for a while. May you too enjoy this encounter, and never forget the journeys that make us all who we are.
